He has been part of the initial regional experts group on developing the Monitoring Matrix for Enabling Environment for Civil Society Development, he has been one of the three members of the BCSDN Task Force to develop Monitoring Matrix Scoring system as well as part of numerous workshops and discussions on BCSDN advocacy. In addition, he has been one of the BCSDN representatives in drafting of the EC Guidelines for civil society support in Enlargement Countries, 2014-2020, as well as led numerous annual monitoring exercises of these Guidelines.

Graduated in Political Sciences, his native is Albanian, he is fluent in English and Serbian and Croatian, and speaks some Italian and German.
