The first issue: <a href="Restrictions on Civic Space and Citizens">Restrictions on Evic Space and Citizens</a> Basic Freedoms informs on the restrictions on basic human freedoms, restrictions of media work and access to information, etc. The second issue: <a href="The State of CSOs">The State of CSOs</a>, their involvement in the Crisis Response & State, and Donors Support shows the challenges with which the civil society in the Balkans has been faced amid COVID-19. The website allows for the comparison of several trends across Balkan countries and incorporates recommendations to CSOs, governments, and donors to tackle the ongoing crisis.
