# **BCSDN STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES**

### **MAIN OUTPUTS**

- Revised Monitoring Matrix methodology
- Comprehensive reports on CSO Enabling Environment (6 national + 1 regional)
- Regional multistakeholder workshop and policy paper on AML/CFT
- Advocacy events in Brussels
- 48 updates on civic space in WBT for the CIVICUS Monitor
- Research actions supported with an ad-hoc grant
- A joint reaction towards the CoE on its report on the regional TF risk assessment of the NP sector in WBT

### **MAIN OUTCOMES**

- The Monitoring Matrix is a powerful platform for advocacy on CSO enabling environment used by members
- Several policy changes on a national level attributed to BCSDN's work with the MM.
- Improved understanding of EC on their role in promoting more enabling environment, as reflected in key EC documents
- Improved understanding, cooperation and commitment among key stakeholders on AML/CFT issues.
- Increased understanding and engagement of civil society actors and donors in the region on SLAPPs

### **MAIN OUTCOMES**

- BCSDN continues to be recognized as a partner to EU institutions
- BCSDN findings are more significantly reflected in EC Enlargement Strategy and Country reports 2023
- Mechanisms for integration of WB civil society in EU processes introduced following long-time BCSDN's advocacy
- BCSDN advocacy contributed to inclusion of Candidate countries in EU Rule of Law Report and EESC ECM Initiative

### **MAIN OUTPUTS**




