The report covers key developments in Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo, North Macedonia, Montenegro, Serbia, and Türkiye during 2023, reflecting on the state of civil society and its vital role in fostering democratic governance and safeguarding fundamental freedoms in the region.

While freedoms of association, assembly, and expression are legally guaranteed, their inconsistent implementation creates severe challenges for CSOs, including restrictive laws, fragile financial sustainability due to unclear fiscal frameworks and limited funding, and deteriorating state-CSO relations marked by superficial consultations, ineffective Councils, and weak CS strategy implementation—undermining civil society’s role and democratic resilience. These issues, with increasing severity, persist into 2024.
